Hounds' Last Game

Charleston Battery 2, Riverhounds SC 1

Game 1

The Hounds' title defense began with a setback on the road. Former Hounds defender Sean Suber scored just before halftime, and Wilmer Cabrera put the Battery ahead 2-0 in the 52nd minute. An own goal by Nathan Messer in the 62nd minute pulled one goal back and set up a frantic but goalless finish.

Last Meeting with Loudoun

Riverhounds SC 2, Loudoun United FC 2
Highmark Stadium, Pittsburgh, Pa. • July 13, 2025
Regular season

A back-and-forth affair ended level after Ben Mines tied the match in stoppage time for Loudoun. Riley Bidois scored in the seventh minute for the guests, but Augi Williams answered with a 12th-minute penalty. Robbie Mertz then put the Hounds ahead 2-1 in the 73rd minute with his second goal in as many matches.

GAME 2 - QUICK STRIKES

- The Riverhounds are the reigning USL Championship winners after claiming the club's first league title in 2025. The team is now in its 27th season of competition, having first taken the field in 1999, making it the second-oldest club in the Championship.
- The Hounds were the first team to win the USL Championship without conceding a single goal throughout the playoffs.
- The Hounds and Loudoun meet for the 18th time since Loudoun's entry into the USL in 2019, the most of any Hounds opponent during that time.
- The two teams met in the preseason on Feb. 13, with the Hounds claiming a 2-1 win at the AHN Montour Sports Complex in Coraopolis, Pa. The Hounds got a goal from Trevor Amann to open the scoring and an own goal to pull back ahead after Arquimides Ordóñez scored for Loudoun.
- Fourth-year Hounds wing back Junior Etou made his 100th appearance for the club in the season opener last week at Charleston to become the 19th player all-time to hit the century mark in Pittsburgh.
- Danny Griffin is wearing the captain's armband for the third season. The sixth-year pro's durability is unmatched in Hounds history, having 192 appearances across all competitions while missing only two league matches since his debut in 2020.
- Pittsburgh native Robbie Mertz scored the game-winning goal in the 2025 Eastern Conference Final against Rhode Island FC. It was the second career playoff goal for Mertz, who last year became only the third player to record 20 goals and 20 assists in their Hounds career.
- Striker Albert Dikwa is back with the Hounds after a transfer deal was agreed with Rhode Island FC, where he played the past two seasons. Dikwa won the 2023 Player of the Year and Golden Boot after a 20-goal season in the Championship, and his 37 total goals in a Hounds uniform rank second in team history.
- Five players made their Hounds debut in last week's match against Charleston: Amann, goalkeeper Nico Campuzano, defender Victor Souza and midfielders Sam Bassett and Max Viera. For Viera, it was also his first match as a professional.
- This is the first full season with head coach Rob Vincent at the helm after he was appointed to the position during the offseason. Vincent — a 20-goal scorer for the Hounds in 2015 — took charge in an acting head coach capacity late in the 2025 season and has a 3-1-4 record in charge.

MILESTONE TRACKER

- Robbie Mertz scored his 23rd goal with the Hounds in the 2025 Eastern Conference Final, putting him one away from entering the team's top 10 by tying José Angulo with 24.
- Danny Griffin has 192 appearances for the Hounds, placing him two behind the 194 of Kevin Kerr (2013-19) for third in club history.

▶ 2026 HONORS

HEAD COACH ROB VINCENT



Announced as the club's 11th head coach in its history on Dec. 19, 2025, Rob Vincent is beginning his first full season as head coach of Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC.

Late in the 2025 season, Vincent was named the team's acting head coach, and the Hounds put together a historic run to close the season. The team went unbeaten in seven matches with Vincent in charge, going 3-0-4 overall, and advanced throughout the USL Championship Playoffs — three times prevailing on penalty kicks — to win the club's first league title. With the victory on penalties over FC Tulsa in the Final, Vincent became the youngest head coach to win a league title at 35 years old.

Prior to assuming the head coaching role, Vincent spent two seasons on the Riverhounds staff under head coach Bob Lilley, a six-time Coach of the Year and the club's all-time leader in matches coached and wins. He made the leap to the First Team and Lilley's staff before the start of the 2024 season, which came after six seasons leading Riverhounds Academy teams competing in the Elite Clubs National League.

Vincent's career began as a youth player with Everton, Crewe Alexandra and Stockport County in England, before he came to the United States to play college soccer at the University of Charleston (W.Va.) from 2009-12. He starred for the Golden Eagles and was three times named a First Team Division II All-American.

Vincent signed with Hounds in 2013, the same year Highmark Stadium opened, and played three years for the club. In 2015, the midfielder had a breakout season with 21 goals in all competitions — still tied for the second-most in club history — and was named to the USL All-League First Team.

Prior to the 2016 season, MLS team D.C. United reached a transfer agreement with Hounds to bring Vincent to Washington, and by season's end, he was a regular starter for playoff-bound United. He began 2017 in a similar role, but he suffered a knee injury in the team's second match that ended his season.

In 2018, Vincent announced his retirement as a player and returned to the Hounds in his academy coaching role.

ASSISTANT COACH

ADAM MITCHELL

- First season with club

Adam Mitchell joins the Riverhounds staff this year after more than a decade of coaching experience at the college level, including the past seven years with nearby Duquesne University as an assistant under head coach Chase Brooks.

During his time at Duquesne, the Dukes advanced to the Atlantic 10 Tournament Final in 2021, hosted A-10 Tournament matches for the first time in 2022 and spent eight weeks ranked in the Division I national rankings, ending an 18-year drought without a Top 25 appearance for the Dukes.

In that same time span at Duquesne, the team produced a total of 13 all-conference selections; the 2023 A-10 Midfielder of the Year, Ask Ekeland; and the first First Round MLS SuperDraft pick in school history, Jayden Da.

First coming to the U.S. as a college player, Mitchell began at Ashland University before moving to Notre Dame College (Ohio), where he helped the Falcons reach two NCAA Division II Tournaments and earned Third Team All-America honors.

After school, he began his coaching career as an assistant coach with Lourdes University and Tiffin University before moving to Duquesne in 2019.



GKS COACH

JON BUSCH

- Fourth season with club

Jon Busch is in his fourth season as the goalkeepers coach for Riverhounds SC. He was previously the goalkeeping coach for Scottish Premiership side Hibernian, and before that, with Indy Eleven in the NASL and USL Championship.

Busch entered coaching after an impressive 21-year professional career that included 14 seasons in MLS. Busch first played in the A-League, where he was named the 2001 A-League Goalkeeper of the Year while helping the Hershey Wildcats reach the league final under Bob Lilley.

He was drafted by the Columbus Crew in the 2002 MLS Super Draft and played there until 2006 before joining the Chicago Fire from 2007-09. In 2008, his best year with the Fire, he was named MLS Goalkeeper of the Year after leading the league in save percentage and tying for the league lead in shutouts. Busch continued his career joining the San Jose Earthquakes in 2010, returning to the Fire in 2015 and finishing with Indy Eleven in 2016-17.

Busch also represented the United States in international play as part of the Under-17 team in the 1993 World Championship. He remained in the U.S. player pool and made his only start at the senior level in 2005, recording a shutout against Colombia, 3-0.

Josh Kremers joins the Riverhounds' First Team staff this season as an assistant coach, as well as the head coach of the club's new USL League Two team launching this Spring.

Kremers is now in his third year with the Hounds organization after joining as the Riverhounds Academy's Boys Regional League Director in 2024. He also coached team in the Hounds Academy in both the 2007-08 and 2012 birth year age groups.

Prior to coming to Pittsburgh, he was the Boys Director of Coaching with FC Carolinas, while also assisting with the Charlotte-area club's teams in USL League Two and the USL W League. Before that was a four-year stint with Indy Eleven, where he helped build the club's side that won the USL Academy League title in 2021.

Kremers also spent time as an assistant with the Charlotte Eagles from 2017-18, winning a USL League Two title in 2017. He has also coached in the college ranks as an assistant to Olivet Nazarene and Indiana Wesleyan.

As a player, Kremers was a three-year starter at Messiah College from 2010-13, which won three NCAA Division III titles during his four years.




