### LOOKING BACK

#### Hounds' Last Game

**Birmingham Legion FC 1, Riverhounds SC 0**  
Protective Stadium, Birmingham, Ala. • April 12, 2026  
Game 6

The Hounds saw their four-game unbeaten run come to a close after a 25th-minute goal by Sebastian Tregarthen handed the Legion only their second win in 13 meetings between the clubs. Both teams had 10 shots in the match, but only one of the Hounds' efforts was on target.

#### Last Meeting with RBNY

First meeting

This is the first time the Hounds have met Red Bull New York, but it will be the third team from the RBNY organization they have faced. The Hounds won 3-1 over the Red Bulls' U-23 NPSL team in the 2014 Open Cup, and they hold an 11-7-2 record against former USL Championship members NYRB II.

### USOC RD. OF 32 - QUICK STRIKES

- The Riverhounds are the reigning USL Championship winners after claiming the club's first league title in 2025. The team is now in its 27th season of competition, having first taken the field in 1999, making it the second-oldest club in the Championship.
- The Hounds were the first team to win the USL Championship without conceding a single goal throughout the playoffs.
- The Hounds are 4-8 all-time against MLS opponents in the U.S. Open Cup, but have a 3-2 mark since 2023 with wins over the New England Revolution, Columbus Crew and New York City FC.
- The Hounds are one of three teams to reach the Open Cup's Round of 32 in each of the past four tournaments, along with MLS side Houston Dynamo and fellow USL Championship club Sacramento Republic FC. The Hounds also earned the prize as farthest advancing lower-division club in both 2023 (Quarterfinals) and 2025 (Round of 16).
- Striker Albert Dikwa, the 2023 Player of the Year and Golden Boot winner in the Championship after a 20-goal season, became the second player to score 40 career goals for the Hounds with his brace March 28 in the win over Sporting Jacksonville.
- Danny Griffin is wearing the captain's armband for the third season. The seventh-year midfielder's durability is unmatched in Hounds history, having 199 appearances across all competitions while missing only two league matches since his pro debut in 2020.
- Griffin scored in both of the Hounds' Open Cup matches in 2026, which gives him fourth career Open Cup goals. That ties him with current head coach Rob Vincent for the most in team history, and with a goal today, he would join Vincent as the only players to score in three consecutive rounds of the Cup.
- Goalkeeper Nico Campuzano is the only Hounds player to have played every minute thus far in 2026, starting all eight matches across all competitions.
- In the past two matches, the Hounds utilized a back three of center backs all in their first year with the club: Lasse Kelp, Victor Souza and Owen Mikoy. Both Kelp and Mikoy are first-year pros who debuted last month.
- Souza is the lone New York native on the team, but the Queens native played his youth soccer in the academy of Red Bull's cross-town rival, NYCFC.

### MILESTONE TRACKER

- Robbie Mertz scored his 23rd goal with the Hounds in the 2025 Eastern Conference Final, putting him one away from entering the team's top 10 by tying José Angulo with 24.
- Mertz also recorded his 23rd assist with the Hounds in the Open Cup win March 31, tying him with Justin Evans and Gary DePalma for the most assists by a Pittsburgh native in club history. (Fifth overall all-time)
- Danny Griffin has 199 appearances for the Hounds, moving him one away from joining Kenardo Forbes as the only players to hit 200 matches in Pittsburgh.

## HEAD COACH ROB VINCENT



Announced as the club's 11th head coach in its history on Dec. 19, 2025, Rob Vincent is beginning his first full season as head coach of Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC.

Late in the 2025 season, Vincent was named the team's acting head coach, and the Hounds put together a historic run to close the season. The team went unbeaten in seven matches with Vincent in charge, going 3-0-4 overall, and advanced throughout the USL Championship Playoffs — three times prevailing on penalty kicks — to win the club's first league title. With the victory on penalties over FC Tulsa in the Final, Vincent became the youngest head coach to win a league title at 35 years old.

Prior to assuming the head coaching role, Vincent spent two seasons on the Riverhounds staff under head coach Bob Lilley, a six-time Coach of the Year and the club's all-time leader in matches coached and wins. He made the leap to the First Team and Lilley's staff before the start of the 2024 season, which came after six seasons leading Riverhounds Academy teams competing in the Elite Clubs National League.

Vincent's career began as a youth player with Everton, Crewe Alexandra and Stockport County in England, before he came to the United States to play college soccer at the University of Charleston (W.Va.) from 2009-12. He starred for the Golden Eagles and was three times named a First Team Division II All-American.

Vincent signed with Hounds in 2013, the same year Highmark Stadium opened, and played three years for the club. In 2015, the midfielder had a breakout season with 21 goals in all competitions — still tied for the second-most in club history — and was named to the USL All-League First Team.

Prior to the 2016 season, MLS team D.C. United reached a transfer agreement with Hounds to bring Vincent to Washington, and by season's end, he was a regular starter for playoff-bound United. He began 2017 in a similar role, but he suffered a knee injury in the team's second match that ended his season.

In 2018, Vincent announced his retirement as a player and returned to the Hounds in his academy coaching role.

## ASSISTANT COACH

### ADAM MITCHELL

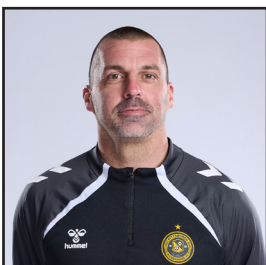
Adam Mitchell joins the Riverhounds staff this year after more than a decade of coaching experience at the college level, including the past seven years with nearby Duquesne University as an assistant under head coach Chase Brooks.

During his time at Duquesne, the Dukes advanced to the Atlantic 10 Tournament Final in 2021, hosted A-10 Tournament matches for the first time in 2022 and spent eight weeks ranked in the Division I national rankings, ending an 18-year drought without a Top 25 appearance for the Dukes.

In that same time span at Duquesne, the team produced a total of 13 all-conference selections; the 2023 A-10 Midfielder of the Year, Ask Ekeland; and the first First Round MLS SuperDraft pick in school history, Jayden Da.

First coming to the U.S. as a college player, Mitchell began at Ashland University before moving to Notre Dame College (Ohio), where he helped the Falcons reach two NCAA Division II Tournaments and earned Third Team All-America honors.

After school, he began his coaching career as an assistant coach with Lourdes University and Tiffin University before moving to Duquesne in 2019.

Jon Busch is in his fourth season as the goalkeepers coach for Riverhounds SC. He was previously the goalkeeping coach for Scottish Premiership side Hibernian, and before that, with Indy Eleven in the NASL and USL Championship.

Busch entered coaching after an impressive 21-year professional career that included 14 seasons in MLS. Busch first played in the A-League, where he was named the 2001 A-League Goalkeeper of the Year while helping the Hershey Wildcats reach the league final under Bob Lilley.

He was drafted by the Columbus Crew in the 2002 MLS Super Draft and played there until 2006 before joining the Chicago Fire from 2007-09. In 2008, his best year with the Fire, he was named MLS Goalkeeper of the Year after leading the league in save percentage and tying for the league lead in shutouts. Busch continued his career joining the San Jose Earthquakes in 2010, returning to the Fire in 2015 and finishing with Indy Eleven in 2016-17.

Busch also represented the United States in international play as part of the Under-17 team in the 1993 World Championship. He remained in the U.S. player pool and made his only start at the senior level in 2005, recording a shutout against Colombia, 3-0.
