### LOOKING BACK

#### Hounds' Last Game

**Riverhounds SC 1, Indy Eleven 0**  
F.N.B. Stadium, Pittsburgh, Pa. • June 13, 2025

Lasse Kelp scored the first goal of his career two minutes into stoppage time, beating former Hounds goalkeeper Eric Dick to give the Hounds a third straight league win. Nico Campuzano made a pair of saves for his third consecutive clean sheet, as the Hounds held nearly 60 percent of possession.

#### Last Meeting with Hartford

A tightly played match saw the Hounds hold an 11-6 edge in shots and 63.2 percent of possession, but neither team found the net through 120 minutes. Eric Dick denied Hadji Barry on the first kick of PKs, and Bertin Jacquesson, Robbie Mertz, Augi Williams and Sean Suber converted to send the Hounds through.

### GAME 12 - QUICK STRIKES

- The Riverhounds are the reigning USL Championship winners after claiming the club's first league title in 2025. The team is now in its 27th season of competition, having first taken the field in 1999, making it the second-oldest club in the Championship.
- The Hounds were the first team to win the USL Championship without conceding a single goal throughout the playoffs.
- Hounds matches in Hartford, where the team has a 6-1-1 record, have a penchant for late-game drama. The Hounds' last four wins in Hartford have had a game-winning goal scored in the 88th minute or later — Russell Cicerone in 2021, Shane Wiedt in 2022, J.C. Obregón in 2023 and Chase Boone in 2025.
- First-year pro defender Lasse Kelp scored the stoppage-time game winner last Saturday against Indy Eleven for his first professional goal. The left back, Kelp, got an assist on the play from right back Perrin Barnes, and both players earned spots on this week's Team of the Week.
- The assist Saturday by Barnes was his third of the season, which gives him the team lead in that category.
- With four clean sheets in the past five matches across all competitions and three shutouts in a row, the Hounds have not conceded in their last 336 minutes of play. That is the longest streak for the team since their 632-minute run that included the end of the 2025 regular season and their entire playoff run.
- Nico Campuzano has a personal streak of three consecutive shutouts in USL Championship play. The first-year Hounds goalkeeper has not conceded in his last 296 minutes.
- Albert Dikwa leads the Hounds with six goals in his first season back with the club after two seasons playing for Rhode Island FC. With his appearance May 15 in the Hounds' USL Cup match at Charlotte Independence, Dikwa also became the 20th player to reach 100 appearances for the Hounds across all competitions.
- Danny Griffin became only the second Hounds player to make 200 appearances for the club April 15 when he started against Red Bull New York in the U.S. Open Cup. The midfielder, in his third year wearing the captain's armband, has missed only three league matches in his seven-year career.
- After today's match, the Hounds will have 14 days until their next match on July 4 against Brooklyn FC. It is the second of three breaks of 13 days or more on their schedule, but the last until the end of September/beginning of October.

### MILESTONE TRACKER

- Robbie Mertz scored his 23rd goal with the Hounds in the 2025 Eastern Conference Final, putting him one away from entering the team's top 10 by tying José Angulo with 24.
- Mertz also is on the cusp of reaching 15,000 regular-season minutes played in the USL Championship. Between Pittsburgh and Atlanta, Mertz enters this weekend with 14,964 minutes in his eight seasons.

**HEAD COACH ROB VINCENT**



Announced as the club's 11th head coach in its history on Dec. 19, 2025, Rob Vincent is beginning his first full season as head coach of Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC.

Late in the 2025 season, Vincent was named the team's acting head coach, and the Hounds put together a historic run to close the season. The team went unbeaten in seven matches with Vincent in charge, going 3-0-4 overall, and advanced throughout the USL Championship Playoffs — three times prevailing on penalty kicks — to win the club's first league title. With the victory on penalties over FC Tulsa in the Final, Vincent became the youngest head coach to win a league title at 35 years old.

Prior to assuming the head coaching role, Vincent spent two seasons on the Riverhounds staff under head coach Bob Lilley, a six-time Coach of the Year and the club's all-time leader in matches coached and wins. He made the leap to the First Team and Lilley's staff before the start of the 2024 season, which came after six seasons leading Riverhounds Academy teams competing in the Elite Clubs National League.

Vincent's career began as a youth player with Everton, Crewe Alexandra and Stockport County in England, before he came to the United States to play college soccer at the University of Charleston (W.Va.) from 2009-12. He starred for the Golden Eagles and was three times named a First Team Division II All-American.

Vincent signed with Hounds in 2013, the same year F.N.B. Stadium opened (then-known as Highmark Stadium), and he played three years for the club. In 2015, the midfielder had a breakout season with 21 goals in all competitions — still tied for the second-most in club history — and was named to the USL All-League First Team.

Prior to the 2016 season, MLS team D.C. United reached a transfer agreement with Hounds to bring Vincent to Washington, and by season's end, he was a regular starter for playoff-bound United. He began 2017 in a similar role, but he suffered a knee injury in the team's second match that ended his season.

In 2018, Vincent announced his retirement as a player and returned to the Hounds in his academy coaching role.

Adam Mitchell joins the Riverhounds staff this year after more than a decade of coaching experience at the college level, including the past seven years with nearby Duquesne University as an assistant under head coach Chase Brooks.

During his time at Duquesne, the Dukes advanced to the Atlantic 10 Tournament Final in 2021, hosted A-10 Tournament matches for the first time in 2022 and spent eight weeks ranked in the Division I national rankings, ending an 18-year drought without a Top 25 appearance for the Dukes.

In that same time span at Duquesne, the team produced a total of 13 all-conference selections; the 2023 A-10 Midfielder of the Year, Ask Ekeland; and the first First Round MLS SuperDraft pick in school history, Jayden Da.

First coming to the U.S. as a college player, Mitchell began at Ashland University before moving to Notre Dame College (Ohio), where he helped the Falcons reach two NCAA Division II Tournaments and earned Third Team All-America honors.

After school, he began his coaching career as an assistant coach with Lourdes University and Tiffin University before moving to Duquesne in 2019.

Jon Busch is in his fourth season as the goalkeepers coach for Riverhounds SC. He was previously the goalkeeping coach for Scottish Premiership side Hibernian, and before that, with Indy Eleven in the NASL and USL Championship.

Busch entered coaching after an impressive 21-year professional career that included 14 seasons in MLS. Busch first played in the A-League, where he was named the 2001 A-League Goalkeeper of the Year while helping the Hershey Wildcats reach the league final under Bob Lilley.

He was drafted by the Columbus Crew in the 2002 MLS Super Draft and played there until 2006 before joining the Chicago Fire from 2007-09. In 2008, his best year with the Fire, he was named MLS Goalkeeper of the Year after leading the league in save percentage and tying for the league lead in shutouts. Busch continued his career joining the San Jose Earthquakes in 2010, returning to the Fire in 2015 and finishing with Indy Eleven in 2016-17.

Busch also represented the United States in international play as part of the Under-17 team in the 1993 World Championship. He remained in the U.S. player pool and made his only start at the senior level in 2005, recording a shutout against Colombia, 3-0.
